The Horizon 2020 project [ADEMU – A Dynamic Economic and Monetary Union](#) analyses the overall monetary and fiscal structure of the EU and the euro area. In particular, the project focuses on the mechanisms that can ensure the long-term sustainability of the EMU and appropriate risk-sharing; the strategies to build resilience to economic shocks; (e.g. coordination of fiscal policies and fiscal multipliers); and the most efficient approaches to manage the interdependence in the euro area (e.g. fiscal and financial imbalances and spillovers and new forms of banking regulations).

The aim of this Summer School is to bring together PhD and post-doctoral researchers working on ADEMU-related topics in order to present and discuss their research, interacting at the same time with ADEMU scholars. For this purpose, we are inviting both theoretical and empirical papers. The programme committee will select a few papers for full presentation, while the authors of non-selected works will still have the chance of briefly describe their own research.

Two key-note speeches will be given on the occasion of the summer school:

- “*Macroprudential Regulation in Economic and Monetary Unions*”, by Jean Tirole (Toulouse School of Economics)
- “*Sovereign Debt Crisis*”, by Tim Kehoe (University of Minnesota)

Travel and accommodation expenses for the authors of the papers selected will be covered by the organizers and a limited amount of funding will be assigned to the other participants upon request.
